

The Andersen Nontraditional Scholarship for Women's Education and Retraining (ANSWER Scholarship)

The Andersen Nontraditional Scholarship for Women's Education and Retraining (ANSWER) was established to provide financial support and encouragement to adult women age 25 and older who are raising school-age children (grades Kindergarten – 12) and are seeking to earn a two-year nursing degree or a four-year undergraduate degree in the field of their choice.

MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY

Scholarship applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be a "nontraditional" female student age 25 or older at the time of the application deadline.
- 2. Be primary caregiver to at least one school-age child (enrolled in grades Kindergarten 12). This includes natural born or legally adopted children or children for whom legal guardianship has been granted. The children must live in the home with the applicant.
- 3. Applicants must be US Citizen, including foreign-born US citizens, and legal residents of Mecklenburg County, North Carolina or a contiguous county in North Carolina or South Carolina (Cabarrus, Catawba, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, Stanly and Union in NC and York in SC).
- 4. Be enrolled or plan to enroll as a full-time, degree-seeking student at an accredited institution in North Carolina or South Carolina, seeking a first-time bachelor's degree.
- 5. Applicants who have already earned a 4-year degree are not eligible to apply.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- Complete the 2013-2014 Free Application for Federal Student Aid application (FAFSA); visit www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- Submit a copy of 2013-2014 Student Aid Report (SAR).
- Send via US mail your completed scholarship application form (Please type your responses). Applications are located on the Foundation's website at www.fftc.org/answerscholarship.
- Send via US mail an official transcript of grades for the applicant's most recently completed coursework. This may include high school transcripts, GED score report or any postsecondary transcripts.
- Send via US mail three recommendation forms from non-related adults such as instructors or other campus administrators, employers, mentors, etc.
- Submit all application materials in a single envelope, including sealed transcripts and recommendation forms.

SELECTION CRITERIA

The Scholarship Committee will consider the following when selecting scholarship recipients:

- 1. Financial need as determined by the costs of college attendance compared with an applicant's household income and other financial factors.
- 2. Demonstrated potential for academic success.
- 3. Preference will be given to single parents.

Finalists will be required to attend a personal interview with the Scholarship Committee

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Scholarship award amounts will vary annually at the discretion of the scholarship committee. Funds are paid directly to the recipient's school and are designated for tuition, fees, books, and supplies. Scholarships are awarded for one year only. Effective with 2011 awards, renewal scholarships are awarded and if the recipient maintains satisfactory performance and meets mentoring requirements:

- In order to qualify for a renewal scholarship, recipients are required to attend either an annual luncheon sponsored by the donor or to meet with the donor prior to December 31 of the current award year.
- Recipients are required to have contact (phone, email, or an in person visit) once a month with an assigned mentor in order to renew their scholarship for the following year. Mentors will be assigned by the Fund, through its Mentors for Mom program.
