Dear Friends,

We're excited to share our first annual report from ANSWER Scholarship! Supporters like you have brought us far in our 10 years, including our first full year as an independent nonprofit. We're grateful for your belief in ANSWER's mission of empowering moms with college degrees so that they can build a stronger future for themselves and their children.

In its 2017 report to the community, The <u>Charlotte-Mecklenburg Opportunity Task Force</u> said a fouryear degree or other post-secondary credential has "become essential in equipping students with the skills and education needed to build successful career paths and to support thriving families." We are proud to help meet that need.

We awarded college scholarships to 14 mothers in Mecklenburg and surrounding counties in 2016. We also saw a surge in fundraising and volunteer support. Volunteers lend their talents as board and committee members, mentors, and speakers.

ANSWER's Mentors for Mom program continues to provide guidance for scholars' success. Monthly meetings have included training for job interviews and how to showcase one's strengths to potential employers. The results: Our graduation rate is an impressive 87%. ANSWER alumni are finding desirable jobs, developing careers, and seeking master's degrees.

Like any organization, we face challenges as well. Mothers are busy; they can be difficult to reach. We hope to raise awareness even further of what we offer and increase our number of highly qualified applicants. Towards that end, we're looking to expand our volunteer network, including social media volunteers to develop content for ANSWER and give us a stronger presence online. Another critical need is volunteers who can help us cultivate relationships with new funders.

We take a long view on some goals. Our mission statement describes our intent to create the desire, expectation and priority of a college education for our scholars' children. While it will take a decade or more to fully assess our success in this area, as some of the children are elementary school, so far the trajectory looks good. Scholars' children tell us how their moms inspire them to work hard in school.

We hope to award 18 to 20 scholarships by the 2018-19 school year. We'd like to increase the size of our scholarships and eventually add paid part-time staff. But for now, I'm happy to celebrate ANSWER's accomplishments. Thank you for standing with ANSWER and investing in us.

MISSION

Our mission is to help women raising school-age children fulfill their dream of earning a college degree, while creating the desire, expectation, and priority of a college education for their children to follow in their footsteps.



SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC MOBILITY



There is a direct correlation between education and social and economic mobility. A full-time worker with a bachelor's degree can earn 60 percent more than a full-time worker with a high school diploma.

With more than 14 percent living below the poverty line in Mecklenburg County, the largest group being women, ANSWER Scholarship is committed to helping close the gap between women and social and economic opportunity by providing scholarship funding, mentoring and professional development.

SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

ANSWER Scholarship recipients share a common goal – to earn a college degree, while positively influencing their children to follow in their footsteps toward an advanced education.

Our scholars come from varying backgrounds but all are mothers raising school-age children, with many working full- and/or part-time jobs, and balancing other life challenges.

A total of 99 scholarships were awarded to 54 mothers since 2006 – increasing year-overyear (includes returning scholars). By 2020, we hope to award more than 20 scholarships annually.

Did you know?

The average scholarship amount per scholar is \$3,500/year.



GRADUATES

Since 2006, 32 mothers graduated from local colleges and pursued full-time jobs in the fields of their choice, business ownership, or graduate school. Our scholars' high graduation rate demonstrates that ANSWER Scholarship helps advance social and economic mobility for mothers and their children.

In 2017, we anticipate three graduates.

MENTORS FOR MOM PROGRAM

Mentors for Mom is our signature program. Scholarship recipients are paired with a mentor for support and guidance on balancing family, work and school. In 2016, we welcomed 13 volunteer mentors; in 2015, we had 14 volunteer mentors.

Scholars and mentors meet one-on-one for support, and also attend six Mentors for Mom meetings during the academic year, sharing experiences and uplifting each other in a safe, supportive environment. The meetings include professional development topics from local experts – networking, personal branding/interview skills, resume writing, financial planning, and health and wellness – intended to provide scholars with new skill sets and valuable information for growth.

ANSWER Scholarship board members and volunteers also attend and participate in the meetings.

PARTNERSHIPS



ANSWER Scholarship works with many organizations, including universities and colleges, houses of worship, businesses, and nonprofits to help advance our mission and elevate issues affecting women, children and our community.

Our university partners include UNC Charlotte, Johnson C Smith, Pfeiffer, Montreat, Gardner Webb, Winthrop, Belmont Abbey, Carolinas College of Health Sciences, CPCC and South Piedmont Community College. These colleges cover nine counties, including Cabarrus, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, Stanly, Union, Lancaster, and York.

In 2016, we partnered with local nonprofits to help raise scholarship funds and bring more awareness to women's issues, including the North Mecklenburg Woman's Club, Carolina Women's Club, and SHARE Charlotte, to name a few.

Several presentations were also made to various civic organizations and churches in 2016, and scholarship recipients collaborated to share their compelling stories.

FUNDRAISING

ANSWER Scholarship coordinates fundraising campaigns to help raise money for college scholarships for women raising school-age children. Funds are also used to create beneficial professional development programs for our scholars during the academic year.

While we partner with local organizations and campaigns to broaden fundraising opportunities, we also commit to doing the work necessary to engage and coordinate signature fundraising campaigns to help drive our mission. These annual fundraisers include a pancake breakfast hosted by a local restaurant and a bowl-a-thon, with increased donations from 2015 to 2016.

In April 2016, we partnered with Applebee's to host a pancake breakfast for 100 guests, raising \$5,817 in donations; in 2015, we raised \$3,485. In October 2016, we hosted a bowl-a-thon, raising \$6,409 in donations; in 2015, we raised \$3,525.





RECOGNITION



In 2016, ANSWER Scholarship was recognized as a GuideStar Silver Participant. GuideStar enables the public to access information about nonprofit organizations, including data. ANSWER Scholarship qualifies for a Silver rating based on our level of reporting on goals, strategies, and measuring metrics.



FINANCIALS

In 2016, ANSWER Scholarship totaled \$148,195 in revenue and \$78,938 in expenses, as outlined in the charts below. Through the generosity of individuals, organizations and other fundraising channels, we awarded \$43,189 in scholarships and \$13,448 in funds for the Mentors for Mom professional development programs.
