



2020-2021 Impact Report

To assist women raising school-age children in fulfilling their dream of earning a college degree, while creating the desire, expectation, and priority of a college education for their children to follow in their footsteps.

ANSWER scholars are the most motivated women I've ever met. In this fiscal year they were an unstoppable force, balancing parenthood, work, university-level academics, and all the effects of COVID-19.

Here's the proof. For the first time in our history, 100% of our college seniors graduated. Of our 12 graduating moms, 10 graduated with honors.

Think about that. Some of our scholars faced illness in themselves or loved ones. All had children at home for virtual school. Each mom showed incredible fortitude and perseverance.

I'm thinking of mothers like Blanca Nowlan, who earned a bachelor's degree from Johnson C. Smith University, studying entirely in English, her second language.

Or Maighia Vang, who will use her undergraduate degree from Queens University to empower those affected by trauma and adversity. She is now pursuing a master's degree in social work.

Or Laurel Helms, who says her achievements at Belmont Abbey College and in ANSWER's program gave her confidence she once lacked.

To be sure, COVID-19 continued to create challenges. ANSWER provided emergency grants to seven scholars to cover books, computer needs, and fees for school. The number of emergency needs was unprecedented.

COVID-19 also influenced the number of applications to our program for the 2021-22 academic year. The stresses that some potential applicants and their families are facing during the pandemic made some moms postpone their hopes for a college education.

While the number of applications was down, the applicant pool was our best ever in qualifications and ambition. We expect great accomplishments from the 18 women in ANSWER this year, representing universities from Winthrop to Carolinas College of Health Sciences. We hope to offer even more scholarships next year if the pandemic is under control.

As always, our Mentors For Mom program supported and cheered on women to graduation day. *Scholars have told us that our mentoring and professional development training, under the leadership of Martha Honeycutt, are just as important as the scholarships towards tuition*. More than 60 volunteers make these programs a success.

We're so grateful to them and to you. In a time of uncertainty, your donations help make upward mobility possible for moms in our community.

In this year's class we had scholars earning degrees from nursing to mathematics, degrees as diverse as the women themselves. These women are true examples of determination and grit. ANSWER is proud to be part of their journey.

ANSWER builds and fosters relationships in our communities. Our scholars have attended 13 colleges across 11 counties. Last year alone our scholars attended Queens, Johnson C. Smith, Belmont Abbey, York Technical, Gardner Webb, Carolinas College of Health Science and UNC Charlotte.




