As a mother of five and the proud wife of a disabled veteran who served his country with honor, we know how to overcome challenges. My husband has a permanent back injury that gives him constant pain. He had a spinal stimulator in his back to help with that pain, along with PTSD, a traumatic brain injury, and other medical conditions.

Being an immigrant plays into my classes as well. I am from the tiny island of Barbados and have lived in Charlotte for the last 15 years. Still, our culture is very prominent in my life, and the fact that education is essential to how I was raised, it was an easy choice to go back to school, again. I wake up with a set plan for the day. Keep it moving. Get the kids out to school and make a list of things for my husband, so he doesn't forget to take his medication or eat the lunch. I go to school, home to dinner and homework for the kids, my own homework, and many other little things that must be done in a day.

I've continued class through surgeries on my hands and eyes. I have an eye disease called Keratoconus, and I have had corneal transplants. On December 29th, 2021, after I finished my semester, I had my 6th surgery on my eyes to add a special lens behind my cornea to help me see better. I keep pushing forward even though sometimes I'm so exhausted I want to crawl into bed and sleep for an entire day. But one step in front of the other, and we keep moving forward. I show them that nothing can defeat them.

My daughter tells all her friends her mom has a 3.5 GPA and is her inspiration. I have a grandson I nicknamed "the toddler overlord" and I want him to see nothing is impossible. My husband looks at me with the same pride I feel when I look at him. He holds my hand and says, "We're doing it, doll," and I know that the challenges of the day were well worth it. I can't say I am any more worthy than anyone else to receive the scholarship because anyone who applies has a need. If awarded, I can focus more on my education and not worry if my books or supplies are taking resources away from the family. That would be a blessing.

At sixteen, I was already a mother; fighting my way out of a world that didn't care for my struggles.
